The Story of Moses: Mighty Moses

SAINT STORY



ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE



St. Maximilian Kolbe was born on January 8, 1894 in Poland. One night as a child he saw the Virgin Mary, who offered him a life of purity or a death as a martyr. Out of obedience, he chose both. He was ordained a priest in 1918, and traveled as far as Japan doing missionary work. He organized the Militia Immaculata, or Army of Mary, to work for conversion of sinners and enemies of the Catholic Church, specifically the Freemasons, through the intercession of the Virgin Mary. The friars

utilized the most modern printing and administrative techniques in publishing catechetical and devotional tracts, a daily newspaper with a circulation of 230,000 and a monthly magazine with a circulation of over one million. Kolbe also used radio to spread his Catholic faith and to speak out against the atrocities of the Nazi regime. When World War II broke out he was again in Poland, and he provided shelter to refugees from Greater Poland, including 2,000 Jews whom he hid from Nazi persecution in his friary. He was arrested and sent to the concentration camp at Auschwitz. He followed the rules, as difficult as it was out of obedience. When three prisoners tried to escape the camp and were caught, ten prisoners were selected to die. One of the ten cried out for his family and his children, and Fr. Kolbe volunteered to trade places with that man and died in his place. In the starvation cell, he celebrated Mass each day and sang hymns with the prisoners. He led the other condemned men in song and prayer and encouraged them by telling them they would soon be with Mary in Heaven, if they were obedient and did not give up their faith. Each time the guards checked on him, he was standing or kneeling in the middle of the cell and looking calmly at those who entered. After two weeks of dehydration and starvation, only Kolbe remained alive. They finally killed him by injecting him with poison. St. Maximilian Kolbe is a great role model for us to live the virtue of obedience to God's will, following the Ten Commandments, and even going further by laying down his life for another.

- Preparation and process
 - Pass out paper to all the members
 - Give some instruction on the importance of good handwriting
 - Encourage the boys to take their time and pray about what to say to the Holy Father
 - Express to them that it is very likely that the Holy Father will either personally read the letters himself or have them read to him
 - Guide the boys through the following structure of writing the letter (for younger boys, they will most likely need the help of the dads – they can also color a picture)

 - o Family Status
 - Picture of family, pet, or other such photo that personalizes the letter or a colored picture in marker or crayon.
 - Interests
 - Talents
